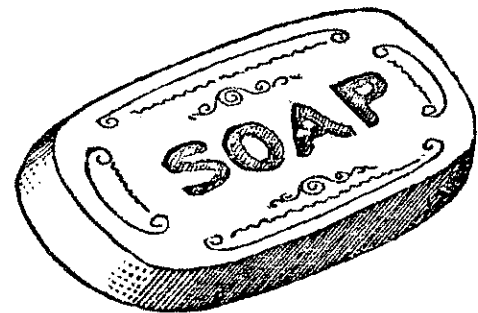
Dave has released 15 albums and has had 12 singles in the Top 25 on the National Jazz Charts.

* ***Adopt a School Program:*** As part of our continuing efforts to strengthen relationships with Mogadore Schools, we are planning to write notes of encouragement and support to all employees. At their opening of school meeting, we want to give them a personal note, a cookie, and a small "starter set" of supplies for their needy students. If you can help in this effort to set a positive tone of support and encouragement, please contact the church office.

We will also continue to provide replacement school supplies for the needy students. Please take advantage of the back to school specials. Collection baskets are in the hallway near the church office.

* ***Back-pack stuffing at Summit County Children's Services on Saturday, Aug. 4 from 9 A.M. – noon.*** Every child in foster-care receives a backpack filled with supplies donated by area organizations and individuals. We join with other volunteers to fill the backpacks with the necessary supplies. It is always enjoyable and rewarding as we make new friends and accomplish this worthwhile ministry. Meet at the church at 8:30 A.M. to carpool.

* ***Mountain of Food:*** Friday, August 17 is the next Open M monthly food distribution. Meet at the church at 7:30 A.M. to carpool.

* ***Heart for the City,*** as the ONLY Mission Church in the *East Ohio Conference*, needs our help. It has been selected to be a major distribution sub-center for the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank. Because of the food bank, they need a major infusion of volunteers on Thursdays. The first Thursday of EVERY month (August 2nd) has a morning distribution requiring helpers from 8:30 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. If you are interested in helping, or need additional information, please notify our church office. Additionally, they host a Thursday evening food program every week. Volunteers are needed from 5:30 – 7:15 P.M. They are hoping to enlist significant support from neighboring congregations like ours and are interested in having individual churches sign up for group participation at least once a quarter. Please consider giving a few hours of your time at least on a quarterly basis. Individual volunteers are always welcomed.

* ***Remember Good Neighbors.*** Food and household items like paper-goods and cleaners are always needed. Clothing and coats in good condition are also needed, especially as winter approaches. Small donations add up to big help.

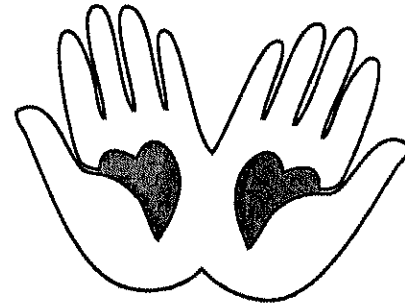

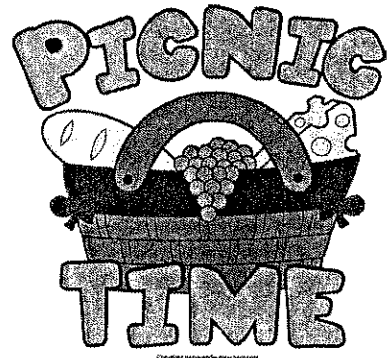
